Mental Health = services for students with mental illness. Then we will only focus on treating mental illness (Tier 3)


Mental Health = positive state of functioning important for overall health (Tiers 1,2,3)



East Forsyth High School Opening Fall 2021

East Forsyth High School

East Forsyth HS (EFHS) will be Forsyth County Schools' 7th traditional high school. It is on an 89.47-acre tract and as constructed, can accommodate 2,125 students. A future addition will allow up to 2,475 students.

The land for EFHS was purchased in 2007 using SPLOST III/2006 Bond funds. The name was selected that same year by the Forsyth County Board of Education after conducting an online community survey. Originally projected to open in 2011, after the Great Recession (2007-09) and subsequent recovery, EFHS construction funding was not secured until the 2017 Bond.

In 2018, the architect was approved, and the school colors and mascot were selected by the high school principals. EFHS' primary school colors are navy blue and orange, with gray as an accent. The mascot is the broncos.








The pathway also places emphasis on the design process, site plans, electrical plans, and plumbing plans.

INDUSTRY NCCER Carpent Certification

Students will learn the basic knowledge to function safely on or around a construction site and provide them a solid foundation in carpentry skills and knowledge. The pathway introduces students to four construction craft areas and allows them to gain Level One Industry Certification in one of the craft areas. Students will learn the history and traditions of carpentry. masonry, plumbing, and electrical craft trades and the care and safe use of hand and power tools as they relate to each trade.



What is a Community School?

"It is the hub of its neighborhood, uniting educators, community partners, and families to provide all students with top-quality academics, enrichment, health and social services, and opportunities to learn and thrive"

(IEL Coalition for Community Schools, 2017).

A Community School provides three types of studentcentered opportunities:

- 1. Powerful learning
- 2. Integrated health and social supports
- 3. Authentic family and community engagement

Through collaboration, East is developing partnerships with Mentor Me North Georgia, Family Ties Inc, and The Place of Forsyth.

The community partners will be working with the Family and Community Engagement Coordinator to match families with supports and services.

Our goal is for East Forsyth High School to be the hub of the East community. The Community School Center will be available to all students, staff, and families.

With the motto "Be Better", EFHS will serve the community by connecting, collaborating and caring with all stakeholders

Family Ties will offer support through the APEX grant and offer direct therapeutic services to students and/or student/families groups based on need.



The Community School Center at East is an equity strategy designed to improve the educational and life outcomes for students. The three EFHS feeder schools - Chattahoochee Elementary, Chestatee Elementary and Little Mill Middle School – are all Title I schools. Many Title I families have experienced lifelong barriers that have negatively impacted their lives. These barriers can significantly impact their well-being: food insecurity, housing instability, unemployment, mental health issues, substance use and abuse, and generational poverty. These types of environmental stressors can negatively impact student learning and behavior in school.
